A native of Pittsburgh, Dr. Alexander received her undergraduate degrees in chemistry and math from Union College at Schenectady, New York. She went on to earn her medical degree from Penn State University's Milton S. Hershey Medical Center.

After completing medical school, Dr. Alexander moved to Colorado, where she completed three residency programs, the first in general psychiatry at the University of Colorado at Denver. This was followed by forensic psychiatry training at Colorado State Hospital at Pueblo, and lastly, a child and adolescent psychiatry at the University of Colorado at Denver. Dr. Alexander is board certified in general psychiatry as well as child and adolescent psychiatry. Prior to working at Shodair Children's Hospital, Dr. Alexander was in private practice for nearly 16 years in Twin Falls, Idaho.

Dr. Alexander practices at Shodair Children's Hospital with Drs. Keith Foster, Katherine Rappaport, Heather Zaluski, and Dan Korb, who are all Board Certified in Adult Psychiatry and Child and Adolescent Psychiatry.
